Green Machine Gets Moving

On Aug. 31, rabbittransit launched a new initiative to connect college students to local area businesses. The bus service, dubbed the "Green Machine," developed out of conversations with the Student Senate from York College to provide access to students to downtown shopping and entertainment.

Future of rabbitEXPRESS

The FTA recently announced it would allocate \$438 million of the FY 2007 Bus and Bus Facilities Discretionary funding (former FY 2007 congressional earmarks) to transit projects in only six cities. No cities within Pennsylvania were among the selected areas.

rabbittransit was hoping to utilize part of this capital funding to purchase an additional vehicle for the rabbitEXPRESS service to Harrisburg as well as vehicles for rabbitEXPRESS service to Maryland. Given the new FTA funding plan, support for the rabbitEXPRESS will be delayed until alternative capital sources can be identified.

We appreciate the patience of our current and future rabbitEXPRESS riders as we forge ahead in our attempts to secure capital funding.

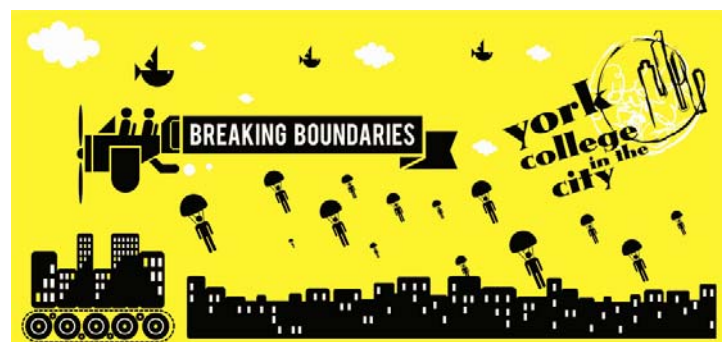
