**rabbittransit Joins the Revolution:
rabbittransit to Sponsor “Kids Run the Bases” of York Revolution**

York, PA – Beginning Sunday, May 4, 2008, rabbittransit will lead the charge after the York Revolution game as it becomes the newest sponsor of “Kids Run the Bases,” a baseball highlight for children of all ages. Now in their second season, the York Revolution is coached by former Baltimore Orioles catcher Chris Hoiles (Manager), and pitcher Tippy Martinez (Pitching Coach). Former Orioles assistant coach Sam Snider also joined the York staff for 2008.

“Partnering with rabbitransit and involving our young fans in the process is the perfect way for these two York County staples to work together, said Revolution General Manager Matt O’Brien. “The big city clubs always have good public transportation to the ballgame, so this relationship and the Revolution bus stop helps legitimize our game day experience.”
