MINUTES OF SRTA BOARD MEETING

January 26, 2023

Present were board members: LaToya Winfield Bellamy, Eric Bugaile, Richard Carson, Carrie Gray, Jarrod Johnson, Richard Kotz, Keith Martin, Raymond Rosen, Kirk Stoner, Thomas Wilson; and Jill Nagy, Counsel, was also present.

Administrative Staff Members present were Miguel Acri-Rodriguez, Stephen Baldwin, Richard Farr, Brian Gillette, David Juba, Jamie Leonard, Eric Maguire, Trevor Manahan, Paul Mathis, Cory Matthews, Jenna Reedy, Richard Trout, Sherry Welsh and Christopher Zdanis.

CALL TO ORDER

The January Board meeting of the Susquehanna Regional Transportation Authority was called to order by Chairman Raymond Rosen at 10:00 AM.

CHANGES OR MODIFICATIONS TO THE AGENDA

No changes or modifications to the agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comment.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion to approve the December 22, 2022, meeting minutes was raised by Richard Carson, seconded by Kirk Stoner, and passed unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS

Harrisburg City Council Resolution 71-2022 Appointment of Gina Roberson Communication.

YAMPO TRANSIT COMMITTEE

There was no YAMPO Transit Committee business.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Keith Martin presented the December 2022 Financial Statement and Statistical Notes. Keith Martin deferred to Stephen Baldwin for further details on the December 2022 Financial Statement and Statistical Notes. Stephen Baldwin noted the following highlights from the report:

- RIDERSHIP: Year to date comparisons to the prior year and to pre-covid levels are as follows:
 - Fixed Route ran 13% above last year and at 61% of pre-covid ridership.
 - Paratransit was 11% above the previous year and 77% of pre-covid ridership levels. An inquiry was made concerning the Dauphin County decline in paratransit ridership.
 Speculation for the decline is that staffing shortages have resulted in poor on-time performance. Partnerships have been formed with recruitment agencies to attempt to alleviate.
 - Commuter Express was 18% above last year (YTD) but only 38% of pre-covid levels.
 - Microtransit's ridership was 304% of the same time last year. Richard Farr commented that the demand in Chambersburg has been strong.
- <u>REVENUE</u>: Year to Date Grant and Contract Income is below budget by \$2.8 million because less subsidy was required than the budget anticipated. This is likely the high point of the year for this favorable variance, since employee pay increases went into effect in January.
- <u>EXPENSES</u>: Year to Date Total Expenses are \$3.5 million or 12% lower than budget. The
 majority of this favorable budget variance continues to be the result of unfilled positions
 resulting in lower than budgeted wages and benefits. Unfilled positions rose to 73 or 12% of
 approved positions in December. A Graph of Open Positions by Division is included within the
 dashboard.
- <u>RESERVES</u>: As of December 31, SRTA had 129 days of cash on hand. The purchase of property next to the Harrisburg facility (Goodwill Property) in anticipation of future facility construction reduced the Authority's cash by approximately \$4.9M at month end. State Reimbursement of this advance was received on January 13, 2023, but is not reflected in the December 31 cash balance. Adding the \$4.9 million receipt in January increases the cash on hand to 183 days.
- LINE OF CREDIT: There are no draws on the organization's line of credit.
- <u>CAPITAL EXPENDITURES:</u> There were not Capital expenditures over \$50,000 for the month of December.

Stephen Baldwin noted that we are working with several financial institutions to identify the most advantageous banking arrangement for the Authority.

Richard Farr referenced a report regarding estimated useful life of vehicles to provide more context as the supply chain for paratransit vehicles has been delayed. We will be programming a new articulated bus.

Stephen Baldwin noted the chart of open positions within the dashboard. Discussion took place regarding recruitment marketing, methods and ideas for retention.

An increase in website traffic was noted on the dashboard. Views for Stop Hopper service have surpassed those for Paratransit service.



That Grants Manager, Chief Financial Officer, Controller, Senior Data Manager, Executive Director and Authority Solicitor is authorized to execute and file with its applications the annual certifications and assurances and other documents the Federal Transportation Administration requires before awarding a federal assistance grant or cooperative agreement.
- 3. That Grants Manager, Chief Financial Officer, Controller, Senior Data Manager and the Executive Director is authorized to execute grant and cooperative agreements with the Federal Transit Administration on behalf of Susquehanna Regional Transportation Authority.

WHEREAS, the Susquehanna Regional Transportation Authority (SRTA) desires to establish a contract for fuel for the period April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, SRTA through a joint procurement with the South Central Transit Authority (SCTA) and the County of Lebanon Transit Authority (LT) has publicly advertised an invitation for bid (IFB) in accordance with all required Federal and State purchasing requirements; and,

WHEREAS, due to the uncertainty of the fuel market, it is believed to be in the best interest of the Authority to award a fixed rate contract; and,

WHEREAS, due to the volatility of the petroleum market, the majority of the bidders will not commit to a fixed bid price until the time of award; and,

WHEREAS, to maximize the benefits of a joint procurement, a contract award must be made from each transit system at the same time within one business day of bid opening; and,

WHEREAS, to award multiple contracts, one from each transit system, is not possible under normal business practices due to each Transit Authority Board of Directors' meeting being held on different dates throughout the month; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors hereby approve and authorize the Executive Director to award a contract to the responsive and responsible bidder offering the lowest fixed cost for Diesel Fuel and meeting all Federal and State purchasing requirements. The Contract will be for the period April 1 2023 through March 31, 2024,

CONTRACT AMENDMENT FOR PARATRANSIT SERVICE

WHEREAS, the Susquehanna Regional Transportation Authority (SRTA) has contracted with Easton Coach Company (ECC) to provide paratransit service in Cumberland and Dauphin Counties; and,

WHEREAS, the initial Contract period expires October 2024, to ensure quality paratransit service throughout the Contract life there is an included provision to allow for service cost adjustments. This adjustment provision allows for SRTA cost savings should ECC costs decrease and allows ECC to request a cost increase should their operating costs increase; and,

WHEREAS, ECC requested and demonstrated the need for a service cost increase and additionally agreed to a billing structure change. This request was reviewed by the operations and finance departments which resulted in a negotiation process between SRTA and ECC; and.

WHEREAS, both parties negotiated in good faith and came to an agreement, which provides a two-tiered hourly rate covering ECC variable costs. Additionally, negotiations yielded a change to the monthly contracted fixed cost of \$1,653.67 which represents a three percent (3%) increase; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that an amendment be made to change the monthly fixed cost to Fifty-five thousand, nine-hundred, eighty-seven Dollars and Zero Cents (\$55,987.00). Additionally, the hourly rate shall be Twenty-four Dollars and Eighty-eight Cents (24.88) per hour for performed services up to Two-thousand, eight-hundred (2,800) hours. The rate for service hours that exceed Two-thousand, eight-hundred (2,800) hours will be reimbursed at Twenty-six Dollars and nineteen Cents (\$26.19) per hour.

 - The Operations team is now utilizing ECC for more than 2,800 hours per month.

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE OPTION YEAR ONE FOR INTERCITY BUS PROGRAM CONTRACTS

FACT SHEET

- Original authorization to negotiate and award contracted services was approved through Board Resolution 2111.
- There are currently two contracted service providers, Fullington and Greyhound operating a selection of the ten (10) routes funded through the Intercity Bus Program.
- Annual operational funding for 2022-2023 for the ICB program's ten (10) routes is \$4,289,079:
 - Fullington's 2022-23 funding to operate seven (7) routes is \$2,868,557.
 - Greyhound's 2022-2023 funding to operate three (3) routes is \$1,420,522.
- Annual operational funding for 2023-2024 for the ICB program's ten (10) routes is not to exceed \$4,634,686, an increase of \$345,608 (8%) over 2022-23, pending final execution of the option year one agreements:
 - Fullington's 2023-24 funding to operate seven (7) routes is \$3,127,872, an increase of \$259,315 (9%) over 2022-23.
 - O Greyhound's 2023-24 funding to operate three (3) routes is \$1,506,815, an increase of \$86,293 (6%) over 2022-23.
- The Intercity Bus Program contracted rates are based on a net operating cost per mile basis.
- The 2023-2024 rates, negotiated by SRTA staff, have been reviewed and received concurrence from PennDOT Bureau of Public Transportation.

 - a. One Authorized Signature for amounts up to \$25,000
 - b. Two Authorized Signatures for amounts above \$25,000 but below \$75,000
 - c. Two Authorized Signatures one being the Executive Director or CFO, for amounts above \$75,000 but below \$150,000
 - d. Two Authorized Signatures including One Authorized Board Member for amounts above \$150,000
 - e. For expenses related to employee benefits, insurance payments, utility payments, subcontractor payments and fuel payments, two authorized signatures are required
- 3. The SRTA Board of Directors authorizes the Executive Director and Chief Financial Officer to execute any and all documents necessary to make available plan benefits for eligible employees.
- 4. In the event any portion of this Resolution is contrary to law, all remaining portions of the resolution shall remain in full force and effect.
